





HISTORY OF LABOR DAY: Labor Day is a United States federal holiday observed on the first Monday in September, that celebrates the economic and social contributions of workers. It was first nationally recognized in 1894 to placate unionists following the Pullman Strike. With the decline in union membership, the holiday is generally viewed as a time for barbeques

and the end of summer vacations.

In 1882, Matthew Maguire, a machinist, first proposed the holiday while serving as secretary of the CLU (Central Labor Union) of New York. Others argue that it was first proposed by Peter J. McGuire of the American Federation of Labor in May 1882, after witnessing the annual labour festival held in Toronto, Canada. Oregon was the first state to make it a holiday on February 21, 1887. By the time it became a federal holiday in 1894, thirty states officially celebrated Labor Day.

Following the deaths of a number of workers at the hands of the U.S. military and U.S. Marshals during the Pullman Strike, the United States Congress unanimously voted to approve rush legislation that made Labor Day a national holiday; President Grover Cleveland signed it into law a mere six days after the end of the strike. The September date originally chosen by the CLU of New York and observed by many of the nation's trade unions for the past several years was selected rather than the more widespread International Workers' Day because Cleveland was concerned that observance of the latter would be associated with the nascent Communist, Syndicalist and Anarchist movements that, though distinct from one another, had rallied to commemorate the Haymarket Affair in International Workers' Day. All U.S. states, the District of Columbia, and the territories have made it a statutory holiday.





PORK CHOP CASSEROLE

From the kitchen of: Phyllis Guetzkow 6 thick boneless Pork Chops or 3 butterfly-halved 1 can Cream of Mushroom Soup 2/3 c. Chicken Broth

1/2tsp. Ground Ginger

1/4tsp. dried Rosemary, crushed or omitted

1 $\frac{1}{2}$ c. Sour Cream, divided

1 (2.8oz.) can French Fried Onions, divided

Brown chops and place in 13X9 inch baking dish. Combine soup, broth, rosemary, and 1 cup sour cream. Pour over chops; sprinkle with half the onions. Cover and bake at 350° for 45 to 50 minutes. Stir remaining sour cream (1/2 c.) into sauce and chops. Top each chop with remaining onions. Return to oven uncovered for 10 minutes. Serves 6.



APPLE CRISP From the kitchen of: *Unknown*

2 tbsp. Sugar ¼ tsp. Cinnamon

4 c. pared & sliced tart Apples

½ c. Flour ¼ c. Water ¼ tsp. Cinnamon 1/8 tsp. Salt 1/3 c. packed Br. Sugar ¼ tsp. Nutmeg

3 tbsp. softened Butter

Mix sugar with cinnamon. Sprinkle over apples and mix lightly. Spread apples in greased 8X8X2 inch baking pan. Sprinkle with water. Blend flour, salt, cinnamon, nutmeg and brown sugar, mix in butter to make a crumbly mixture. Spread over apples. Bake uncovered for 35 to 40 minutes or until lightly browned and apples are tender.
